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
ON THE OTHER SIDE Center of Contemporary Art – Tbilisi, Georgia, June 2021 Co-Curator

The exhibition "ON THE OTHER SIDE" focused on going beyond limits in a wide variety of contexts. In everyday life we often experience barriers or restrictions, be it national borders or limitations of the human mind. This phenomenon was particularly noticeable in the pandemic-related lockdowns. Limitations manifest themselves physically through two polar sides: an inside or outside, protection or confinement, a here or there. This exhibition combined paintings and drawings dedicated to the examination of limitations and their transgression. Inward and outward processes eventually open up new perspectives.

RENDEZVOUS IM BAD – 10 Years Schaumbad! Worklabs, Exhibition, Performances Schaumbad – Freies Atelierhaus Graz, Austria, August - October 2018 Co-Curator

For this exhibition, which dealt with collaborative processes, artists from the studio house Schaumbad invited colleagues from all over the world to come to Graz for working together on projects on site. The thematic starting point was the changing communication culture due to the introduction of new technologies and platforms such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram etc. Although the flow of communication is increasingly facilitated by these innovations, the interaction remains superficial. Interpersonal relationships are increasingly losing their intensity. The exhibition attempted to counter this phenomenon with various joint projects. Within worklabs creative work situations were created, the results of which could be seen in the subsequent exhibition.

Shop Window Gallery SCHARF, Graz, Austria 2016-2018 Co-Curator

Shop Window Gallery SCHARF questioned the white cube per se. Oscillating between the urban fabric of the city and gallery space, art was created. The exhibitions reflected on a variety of socio political and sometimes precarious issues. The special location of the shop window gallery in the city center of Graz as well as the unrestricting viewing possibilities made it possible to address a diverse audience. By eliminating all barriers, fear of thresholds was avoided, making the shop window gallery freely accessible to all persons.

A total of 16 exhibition projects were realized at Shop Window Gallery Scharf. The openings were accompanied by performances that took up the theme of the work on display.

Shaman and Medicine Man kunstGarten, Graz, Austria, April – May 2018 Co-Curator

Human and nature are connected since the beginning of their coexistence by the ritual with each other. This connection not only consists in the fact, that in early shamanic or religious rituals a diverse collection of herbal and animal objects from the nature assumed the material implementing of a ritual. In addition, many rituals with shamanic background deal with the spiritual connection with the nature and its energy. In the art liminality (the state during the ritual that describes the transition period between two states) and the concomitant intensity emotion consistently is used by artists in installations and other media.
